Approximately 150 members attended and plenty of time was allowed to answer questions.

- Jayne Ayres authored an article on rider biomechanics for the July/August issue of USDF Connection.
- The L Program Part 1 Facebook group has 1,414 members.
- The closed Facebook group for L candidates (in Part 2) and graduates has 667 members.
- There are 175 current L graduates with distinction and 166 current L graduates listed on the USDF website.
- Worked in cooperation with the US Eventing Association to allow the Association to use the A Session presentation for their judge education clinic in September. L faculty member Debbie Rodriguez will be the presenter.
- To date, there are 23 L Education Program sessions scheduled for 2024. Programs are being hosted by:
